Reflecting on God's Word

"O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel!" So begins the familiar chant that will be heard in churches throughout the world this Advent. It is based on the O Antiphons, which are the verses for the Gospel acclamation at Mass on the last seven days of Advent. Each of those antiphons prays for the coming of Christ, and each one seems to capture the spirit of a different Sunday of Advent. The verse that harmonizes with this Sunday's scriptures expresses our longing for the "Radiant Dawn" of the Lord's coming at the end of time when the "sun of justice" will "shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death." In the readings we hear Isaiah describe the peaceful "days to come," when all will "walk in the light of the Lord!" (Isaiah 2:2, 5). Paul tells us it is time "to awake from sleep" and "put on the armor of light" for "the day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 13, 12). Jesus, too, cautions us to "stay awake" to be ready for the "day your Lord will come" (Matthew 24:42).

All around us we seem to be getting a similar message: "No time to waste! Only thirty shopping days left till Christmas! Don't be caught unprepared!" What's the difference between the two messages? One tells us to anticipate a day of giving and getting and eating and drinking. We might prepare for that day by rushing and buying and wrapping and baking. The other tells us to anticipate a day, not of avarice and jealousy, but of justice for the oppressed and peace on earth. We will prepare for that day when we "throw off the works of darkness" and "put on the Lord Jesus Christ."

Reflexionemos sobre la Palabra de Dios

La aclamación al Evangelio en las Misas de los últimos siete días de Adviento proviene de las siete Antifonas. Cada una de esas antifonas ora por la venida de Cristo y todas parecen captar el espíritu de los diferentes domingos de Adviento. El versículo que sintoniza con las Escrituras de este domingo expresa nuestra añoranza por "el Resplandor de la luz eterna" de la venida del Señor al final de los tiempos cuando el "sol de justicia" vendrá "a iluminar a los que viven en tinieblas y en sombra de muerte". En las lecturas de hoy escuchamos a Isaías describir la paz del "final de los tiempos" cuando todos "caminemos a la luz del Señor" (Isaías 2:2, 5). Pablo nos dice: "ya es hora que despierten del sueño" y nos exhorta a que nos "revistámonos de las armas de la luz", pues "el día se acerca" (Romanos 13:11, 13, 12). Jesús también nos advierte estar "atentos" y preparados "porque no saben qué día llegará su Señor" (Mateo 24:42).

Todo a nuestro alrededor parece darnos un mensaje similar: "¡No hay tiempo que perder! ¡Sólo quedan treinta días para la Navidad! ¡Que no lo agarre desprevenido!" ¿Qué diferencia hay entre los dos mensajes? Un mensaje nos dice que nos preparemos para un día de dar y recibir, de comer y beber. Para ese día podríamos prepararnos comprando y estando a la carrera, envolviendo regalos y horneando. Mientras que el otro mensaje nos pide prepararnos para ese día sin avaricia ni celos, sino con justicia para el oprimido y paz en la tierra. "Despojémonos de las obras de las tinieblas" para prepararnos para ese día y pongamos atención a la exhortación de san Pablo: "revístanse de Jesucristo, el Señor".

MEMORIAL OF NICHOLAS, BISHOP

Saint Nicholas spoke out against heresies and was imprisoned for a time for his Christian beliefs. His faithfulness is exemplary, but charity remains his signature virtue. What started with Nicholas tossing a few bags of coins into a poor family's yard has been transformed over centuries of retelling, embellishing, grafting, and adapting into the

magical tales of Ole Saint Nick (Father Christmas, Santa Claus, Kris Kringle), whose yearly ambition is to deliver gifts to every girl and boy. We may not bring out our best robes and a fattened calf for the annual return of Santa, but cookies and milk serve nicely to show our gratitude to Saint Nick for inspiring ole souls of every stripe to be more jolly and generous.

SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY; PATRONAL FEAST DAY OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

Rejoice with Mary today

Today we celebrate not only the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, but also the anniversary of the declaration of this solemnity and the doctrine behind it. In a sense this day answers a question: How could Jesus, who was human in every way but sin, be born without original sin? Answer: Mary must have been without sin, therefore she was "immaculately conceived." In a larger sense this day encourages us to honor the special holiness and closeness to God of Mary as the woman who brought the Savior into the world. It also declares God's grace and love to be greater than sin's destructive effects. Pray to Mary today and rejoice that we can turn to such a wonderful figure.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Genesis 3:9-15, 20; Ephesians 1:3-6, 11-12; Luke 1:26-38 (689)*. "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you."

MEMORIAL OF JUAN DIEGO CUAUHTLATZIN

More than meets the eye

There are many accounts of the apparitions of the Virgin of Guadalupe in 1531 to Saint Juan Diego, an indigenous Mexican who had converted to Catholicism after the Spanish conquest. There are also many questions about the historical accuracy of those accounts. But great stories also serve a purpose beyond historical literalism—they speak to our hearts of greater truths that are sometimes best captured in epics. A great mythic story is not necessarily false—it can be true at a deeper, more symbolic, and powerful level than facts alone can approach. Dip into some deeper truth by searching online for good accounts of the Guadalupe story.

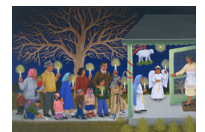
Giving Tree

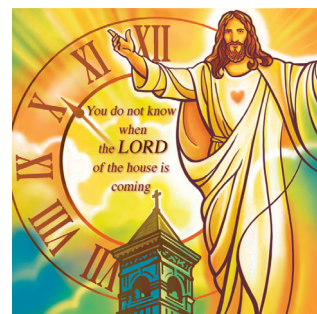
